AGE-ing

Andy Murray

Plenty of column inches in the newspapers last month were devoted to Andy Murray's retirement. Our greatest ever tennis player has been struck down in his early thirties by wear and tear injuries to his hip, preventing him from even tying his shoe laces without pain. The praise for his achievements has been lavish.

One perceptive commentator wrote, about the cost of his dedication to becoming the best he could be; 'The road to extreme physical strength can in the end lead to enfeeblement'. Plenty of ex-sports people would say AMEN to that!

But there again, plenty of us end up becoming enfeebled without ever experiencing the stage of extreme physical strength.

Andy's retirement will present him with a big challenge - how to adjust to a new phase of life which is empty of that which has given most meaning to his life to date.

One important key to adjusting has to be ACCEPTANCE.

As the famous prayer goes,

God give me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, The courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.

Gratitude

Another key attitude that will help Andy is if he can be thankful for all that he has achieved rather than fall prey to bitterness over what might have been. Saying thank you is a choice we can make which will make us feel better and make other people find us easier to help. Dag Hammerskjold was an enthusiastic advocate of gratitude.

He became Secretary- General of the United Nations in 1953. He was selected as a 'harmless', compromise candidate but soon made his presence felt by working tirelessly for peace and justice. A man of great faith, he was personally responsible for the creation of a meditation room at U.N. headquarters in New York, available to people of any faith to use for silent thought, contemplation and prayer.

President John F. Kennedy described him as the greatest statesman of our twentieth century. He was killed in an air crash in Africa in September 1961 on his way to try and broker a peace deal in the Congo.

Two months previously he penned a poem which ended in the words;

Weep if you can. Weep, but do not complain. The way chose you- and you must be thankful.

He was an admirer of Meister Eckhart who wrote;

If the only prayer you ever say in your entire life is 'Thank you', that will be enough.

Expectancy

The third key for Andy will be to look forward.

Visiting an elderly lady in hospital once, I was blown away by her positive attitude. She had suffered from Parkinson's Disease for years which put an early end to her career as a very good amateur artist. Eventually she moved into a care home and had a heart attack. Curled up in her hospital bed, hardly able to move, her face brightened when I arrived. 'I'm so glad you have come. Will you pray with me, for God to show me what he wants of me from now on'.

What an amazingly positive attitude.

No self pity, no regrets, Just, what has God got lined up for me from now on?

Acceptance- Gratitude- Expectancy (AGE'

This is a recipe for facing life, whatever age we are.

In the words of Dag Hammerskjold

For all that has been THANKS. For all that will be YES.

PREPARATION OF NEW ELECTORAL ROLL

The Church electoral roll is the foundation of the whole structure of synodical government in the church. It contains the names and addresses of everyone who can vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. Every 6 years each parish is required to prepare a new electoral roll. This year 2019 a new electoral roll must be prepared.

Notice is hereby given

That under the Church Representation Rules a new Church Electoral Roll is being prepared. All persons who wish to have their names entered on the new Roll, whether their names are entered on the present Roll or not, are requested to apply for enrolment not later than Tuesday 12th March 2019. The new Roll will come into operation on Tuesday 19th March 2019. The Roll shall be published for not less than 14 days before the Annual Church parochial meeting (APCM). Which is to be held on Tuesday 2nd April 2019.

Under the Church Representation Rules any lay persons are entitled to have their names entered on the roll if they—

- (i) are baptised and aged 16 or over;
- (ii) have signed a form of application for enrolment; and either
- (iii) are members of the Church of England or of any Church in communion with the Church of England being resident in the parish or (not being resident in the parish) having habitually attended public worship in the parish during the six months prior to the application for enrolment; or:
- (iv) are members in good standing of a Church (not in communion with the Church of England) which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity declaring themselves also to be members of the Church of England and having habitually attended public worship in the parish during the period of six months prior to enrolment.




